Introduction

The authors have to read and sign the following form that itemize main issues of research and publishing their research Work.

Issues listed deals with *copyright transfer agreement, authorship statement, disclaimer and disclosure statement, ethics board review.*

The first author should photocopy this document and distribute to co-authors for their original ink signatures.

Only the completed forms should be submitted scanned and uploaded on the Journal website www.rjlm.ro by the corresponding author together with the work, tables, etc.

Submitting this agreement form is mandatory for accepting the Work and for any further decisions regarding its publication in the Journal.

Every author signing this document accepts that the content is true and free of ethical or legal issues.

1. Copyright transfer agreement

Conditions of submission retained rights

Except for copyright, any other proprietary rights related to the Work itself shall be retained by the authors themselves.

To reproduce any text, figures, tables, or illustrations from the Work in future works of their own, the authors must obtain a written permission from the Romanian Journal of Legal Medicine at the following adress: Institutul National de Medicina Legala Mina Minovici, sos. Vitan Barzesti nr. 9, sector 4, 042122 Bucuresti; such permission cannot be unreasonably withheld from the authors by the Romanian Journal of Legal Medicine or Romanian Society of Legal Medicine.

Transfer of copyright authors' own work

In consideration of the Romanian Journal of Legal Medicine's publication of the Work, the authors hereby transfer, assign, and otherwise convey all copyright ownership worldwide, in all languages, and in all forms of media now or hereafter

known, including electronic media such as CD-ROM, Internet, and Intranet, to the Romanian Journal of Legal Medicine.

If the Romanian Journal of Legal Medicine should decide for any reason not to publish an author's submission to the Work, the Romanian Journal of Legal Medicine shall give prompt notice of its decision to the corresponding author, this agreement shall terminate, and neither the author nor the Romanian Journal of Legal Medicine shall be under any further liability or obligation.

Should the Romanian Journal of Legal Medicine request copies of such written releases, authors shall provide them in a timely manner before publishing.

4.Disclosure statement

Conflict of interest and financial disclosure
